Banff Pork Seminar 2018 will inform, challenge industry

Edmonton, Alta. Oct. 30, 2017: The big issues in the pork industry and the best people to interpret them, all in one of the most scenic places on the planet. That's what the 47th Banff Pork Seminar promises Jan. 9 to 11, 2018 at the Banff Springs Hotel in Banff, Alta.

"We always have a powerhouse program and the 2018 Seminar is no exception," says Seminar program co-chair, Dr. Ruurd Zijlstra of the University of Alberta. "Innovation, latest technology, challenging thinking on the big issues of the day combined with production information that producers can implement immediately."

He is followed by the always informative Dr. Ron Plain, economist from the University of Missouri-Columbus who will talk hog market outlook and pricing methods.

A closing plenary session on Thursday afternoon features Kansas farmer and advocate Greg Peterson whose innovative videos and social media advocacy approaches reach millions of people. His topic is "I'm farming and I grow it – An AgVocating success story."

A selection of breakout sessions each morning and afternoon tackle topics that most directly affect production. Topics include mycotoxins, farm labor, feeding the grow-finish pig, piglet management, newest innovations, sow lifetime productivity, and swine health and antibiotics.
